



MAPS PPP is designed to help governments and partners identify the strengths and weaknesses in the way a country procures PPPs, enabling the development of targeted reform recommendations tailored to the specific context of the assessed jurisdiction.

PPP refers to any contractual arrangement between a public authority and a private entity for the provision of a public asset or service in which the private party takes some risk and management responsibility.

Key facts about MAPS PPP

Can be used independently or with MAPS MAIN

Follows the same process and requirements as the MAPS MAIN

Typically takes 5-10 months to complete depending on context

Typically costs 75,000 to 125,000 USD (consultants and logistics)

Follows the MAPS 4-pillar structure

Is fully aligned with international good practices

MAPS PPP assesses whether:

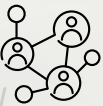
- ◇ The country's national legal and regulatory framework establishes a solid foundation and effectively enables the procurement of PPPs.
- ◇ Institutional and governance structures are in place to support the effective procurement of PPPs.
- ◇ The national system facilitates efficient PPP procurement operations for all stakeholders throughout the entire procurement cycle.
- ◇ The system actively promotes transparency, accountability, and integrity in PPP procurement processes.

MAPS PPP

is not an audit or technical evaluation of a specific project. It focuses mainly on publicly-led PPPs but includes a limited number of criteria that apply to privately-led PPPs.

Is MAPS PPP right for you?

MAPS PPP will be most valuable if the answer to most of the questions below is yes. Applying MAPS PPP will allow you to identify strengths and prioritize improvements to what you have already started to implement.



Are PPPs enabled?



Are at least some institutions procuring PPPs?



Are provisions related to PPPs already included in policies, legislation and/or regulation?



If the answers to these questions are negative, the output of an assessment will most likely be limited to providing a baseline for the shortcomings of the system.
