As the first country in the European Union to have completed a MAPS assessment, Greece represents a fascinating example for other countries in the bloc and beyond. Greece has embarked on a comprehensive journey to thoroughly scrutinize its entire public procurement system, to identify both institutional and operational strengths and weaknesses as well as legal and regulatory ones. The Greece MAPS report details how an overarching legal framework (the EU directives), which is shared across 27 EU member countries, the EEA and EU accession countries, is implemented in the context of a specific public procurement system.

In the webinar we will focus on institutional reform, e-procurement, and capacity & professionalisation, which are three key strategic dimensions identified in the assessment report.
